

1 Introduction

It is our policy that children can wear a school uniform which consists of a yellow polo shirt and a blue sweatshirt/hoodie. A blue checked dress can be worn in summer, no child will be discriminated against should they/their parents wish them to wear non-logo uniform items. We provide a list of the items available for school uniform on our school website or on the teachers2parents/school money app, via 'the shop'

2 Aims and objectives

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

3 Jewellery

Children are allowed to wear stud earrings but are not permitted to wear any jewellery during PE, swimming lessons and games.

4 Extreme haircuts

The school hopes that parents act responsibly in the choice of haircuts and hair colour for their children.

5 Footwear

On the grounds of health and safety, we ask parents to dress children in sensible rather than fashionable clothes and footwear. Black trainers can be worn as an alternative to shoes. Flip flops, open back sandals or high heels are not permitted.
