OUR SCHOOL VALUE THIS HALF TERM IS 'RESILIENCE'






In DT this half term we will learn what free standing structures are, what makes them strong or weak, stable or unstable. Children will experiment and explore using a range of materials and construction kits learning various building techniques. Finally, we will design and build our own Parthenon using the skills we have learnt.

## SUPPORTING LEARNING AT HOME

**Reading homework** — Please do hear your children read their school reading books, they are always so proud when they have learnt to read their book fluently. Becoming a fluent, confident reader takes lots of practise.

Do write in their diaries for each read as the children collect points towards the Reading Olympics awards for every read. 20 reads gain a bronze award, 30 a silver and 40 a gold and 50 is platinum. It would be amazing if all children could reach at least bronze this half term — it is only 20 reads.

**Topic homework** – Please see the topic homework ideas grid for a selection of things for you to have a go at. Do remember to send homework to school, quality homework is worth 5 dojos! Some super lanterns produced last half term!

**Maths homework** – Maths homework will be sent home on Friday's and is due to be completed by the following Friday.
