### **NEW TOPIC – Geography – Sustainability – How can the school reduce its plastic waste?**

This term the children will be using their geography skills to understand the amount of plastic that we're using school and how we might be able to reduce so that we become more sustainable we will investigate why we use plastic, if there are any alternatives and how we may be able to reduce our usage.

## SUPPORTING LEARNING AT HOME

### **Class reader**

Thanks for an excellent start to the first term and how all our children were quickly up to speed with their reading both in school and at home. It is still vitally important that all children can read fluently, and your help is appreciated. # HOMWORK CHALLENGES - CLASS 6 SPRING 1 2025

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This term, we will be broadening our use of Geography skills and putting our hand to reducing the amount of plastic that we use. We will also be writing some stories and trying to improve the standard of our writing. For your homework, you can choose which activity to complete. For some of them, you could record your results electronically, or the finished project could come to school. Remember, it does not need to be here until nearer the half term holidays so have a think and take your time.



In English, we are learning all about a mythical bird called the Firebird. Can you make your own version of a firebird using things you have at home. Try and use some of the skills you have learnt in art or D&T.



In science, we are learning all about how we can mix and separate different substances. See if you can find as many ways as possible to separate different materials. Can these methods help us reduce or recycle all the plastic we use?



In topic we are looking into how we can reduce the amount of plastic that we use both within school and at home. Undertake a survey and record how much plastic you use at home and where this all comes from. Perhaps you can record the information in a bar chart



In R.E. we are learning about why Hindus want to be good. We will also learn about what it means to be a Hindu in Britain today. See what you can find out about the beliefs of Hindus and understand what the words karma, dharma and some samsara might mean to a Hindu.
