


## CRAVE CURRICULUM History – ‘Famous Explorers’ Welcome back to Spring 2 in Class 3!


The Class 3 team hope you all had a great half term – we’re ready for lots of new adventures in Spring 2!

### SUPPORTING LEARNING AT HOME

**Reading homework** – Please do hear your children read their school reading books as often as you can. They are always so proud when they have learnt to read their book fluently. Becoming a fluent, confident reader takes lots of practise and the reading you all do at home makes a huge difference to your child in school.

Please write in your child’s diary for each read, as the children collect points towards the Reading Olympics awards for every read. 20 reads gain a bronze award, 30 a silver and 40 a gold and 50 is platinum. Children also collect Dojos for reading at home. **The children who have the added benefit of reading regularly at home make the most progress in their phonics, reading and writing development.**

**Topic homework** – Please see the topic homework ideas grid for a selection of things for you to have a go at. Do remember to send homework to school, quality homework is worth 5 dojos!

**Maths homework** – Maths homework will be sent home on Fridays and is due to be completed by the following Friday.
